Outreaks of measles are reported worldwide

- Be measles protected with FREE measles vaccines

Summary

- In the past week NSW, Queensland, Victoria and WA have all reported measles cases in returnees from overseas destinations with onward transmission in Australia also occurring.
- Outbreaks of measles have been reported in Asia (including Indonesia and India), Africa, Europe (including the UK), the Middle East and the USA.

Measles Prevention

- Measles is vaccine preventable and the best protection against it is a measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) containing vaccine. 2 doses of vaccine is required, at least 1 month apart.
- The MMR vaccines are **FREE**, safe and very effective. This is a reminder to check that people **are** up to date with their vaccines and protected against measles.
 - Children receive their 1st dose of MMR vaccine at 12 months and 2nd dose at 18 months.
 - Offer FREE measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine to people born during or after 1966
 who do not have documentation of having received 2 doses of measles-containing vaccine.
 Vaccinate all individuals who are unsure of their vaccination history. There is no need to check measles serology prior to vaccination.
 - Anyone planning overseas travel should make sure they have received appropriate travel vaccinations, including MMR vaccine.
 - Children travelling overseas to high risk areas before 12 months can have a MMR vaccine from 6 months of age followed by 2 age appropriate MMR vaccines.
